Facing the unknown COVID-19 pandemic Experiences of nurses and nursing assistants



BACKGROUND


Pandemics adversely affect health systems and health professionals. This study, conducted in Italy, Austria, and Germany, investigated the challenges faced by nurses and nurse assistants in the care of COVID-19 patients in hospital and long-term care.

METHODS

Qualitative exploratory design. Purposive sampling (n=41): nurses (n = 30), nurse coordinators (n = 6), nurse assistants (n = 5) from hospitals (n = 32) and long-term care facilities (n = 9) in Austria, Germany, and Italy. Data collection: August - December 2020. Instrument: online semi-structured interviews & field-notes. Data analyzed with Mayring's qualitative content analysis.



RESULTS



CONCLUSIONS

Some of findings can be applied to reduce these challenges and create better working conditions for nurses and nurse assistants in similar events. Further research, training of staff, and adaptation of institutional policies is needed.




Training
